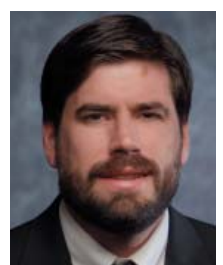
School of Law Names New National AgLaw Center Directors

Lecture to Focus on Death, Suicide, Morality, and the Law



Melvin I. Urofsky, Professor of History Emeritus at Virginia Commonwealth University, will present, "Do Go Gentle Into That Good Night: Thoughts on Death, Suicide, Morality and the Law," on Nov. 7 in the E. J. Ball Courtroom. Professor Urofsky's lecture is part of the Hartman Hotz Lecture Series sponsored by the School of Law and Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences. Professor Urofsky is a leading historian with an emphasis on bioethical issues and physician-assisted suicide. He is a professor at the Center for Public Policy and former chair of the Department of History and Geography at Virginia Commonwealth University.
