We accept applications throughout the year (beginning September 15) and offer admission on a rolling basis, while space is available. Applying earlier in the season, before April 1, ensures consideration for scholarships and increases the likelihood of available seats. Meet with the pre-law advisor at your undergraduate school. Meet with your undergraduate school's pre-law advisor to get advice on undergraduate course selection, Law School Admission Test (LSAT) preparation, and which schools might be a good fit for you. Create your LSAC (Law School Admission Council) account. You need a LSAC Applicant account to register for the LSAT and apply to law schools. Go to https://www.lsac.org/jd-applicants for more information. Register and prepare for the LSAT. Applicants should take the LSAT before the end of February of the year in which they wish to enroll. Applications to the School of Law may be submitted prior to taking the LSAT. Register for LSAC's Credential Assembly Service (CAS). CAS compiles your transcripts, letters of recommendation, and any other documents required for each application and transmits them to each school for you. Request and send official transcripts. Once registered for CAS, you must have each undergraduate and/or graduated institution you attended send an official transcript directly to LSAC. Prepare your personal statement, resume, and diversity statement. In your statement, tell us about yourself, your background, and why you want to attend the University of Arkansas School of Law. You may also include an optional diversity statement. Ask mentors to send a letter of recommendation through LSAC. We require a minimum of two-and a maximum of four-letters of recommendation. Apply online. Once you've uploaded your application materials to your LSAC account, visit https://law.uark.edu/academics/jd/jd-how-to-apply.php, click the "Apply Now" button, and login with your LSAC account information to apply. Make sure you will have prerequisites completed. Applicants must have completed all requirements for a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution prior to the date of enrollment in the School of Law. Visit us!
