Instructions Application for Admission

For International Students LL.M. Program in Agricultural and Food Law University of Arkansas School of Law

International applicants for admission to the LL.M. Program in Agricultural and Food Law must submit the following documents:

1. Completed Application for Admission for International Students

2. Current resume or CV

3. Statement of Interest (describing the applicant's interest in agricultural and food law studies)

4. An official transcript from each post-secondary college and university attended (including law schools), whether or not a degree was received. Transcripts should be sent from the institution directly to the LL.M. Program. Transcripts should explain the school's grading system and indicate academic standing, preferably by class rank or designation of honors achieved. Law transcripts should indicate each subject taken and the academic marks received in each subject. For programs delivered in a language other than English, an official English translation must be appended.

5. Two (2) letters of recommendation supporting the application sent directly from the person making the recommendation to the Program. The application form requires the names of two additional references that may be contacted by the Program Director.

6) International students whose native language is not English must meet the <u>English proficiency requirements</u> for international admissions set by the University of Arkansas Graduate School and submit English proficiency test results. Additional evidence of language proficiency may be required by the Graduate Legal Studies Committee.

Any additional documentation that may be helpful in assessing the applicant's qualifications for the Program may be submitted in addition to the required documents.
