

## **CHALLENGING LIMITED JURISDICTION**

The parties (both residents of Wisconsin) sign a contract in Wisconsin, to be fulfilled in Wisconsin. The plaintiff then moves to Maine; the Defendant to Arizona; plaintiff wishes to sue for breach of contract for \$15,000.
