

2023 Summer Public Service Fellowship Application Instructions

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis. To apply, please upload all the documents listed below to the <u>2023 Summer Public Service Fellowship Program TWEN site</u> no later than **11:59 p.m. on Sunday, March 19, 2023**. More information about the fellowships can be found on the <u>School of Law's website</u> and on the Squire Patton Boggs Foundation's <u>website</u>. Please contact <u>Professor Sara Gosman</u> if you have any guestions or would like to discuss any aspect of the program.

1. The completed Summer Public Service Fellowship Application form, including the Character and Fitness Disclosure Note that having character and fitness information to disclose does not preclude

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- 2. A current resume If possible, the resume should be reviewed in advance by Career Services
- 3. An unofficial law school transcript A printed grade report is acceptable Note that high academic achievement is not a fellowship requirement
- 4. Personal statement of up to 1,200 words that:
 - Describes your career goals and where you hope to practice law;
 - Explains how your summer public service position furthers these career goals;
 - Discusses your previous public service experience and/or activities demonstrating your commitment to public service;
 - Describes your specific financial need for this grant and how you will pay for summer living expenses if you do not receive this fellowship; and
 - Provides any additional personal details that you think will help the selection committee evaluate you as a fellowship candidate.
- 5. Proof of an offer from a qualifying public service employer

The offer letter should include your start and end dates, the scope of work you will perform, and affirmation that you will be supervised by a licensed attorney. See the attached sample letter.

Qualifying public service employers include governmental entities, non-profit organizations, and other non-governmental organizations that are not for profit. Applicants for a SPBF Public Policy Fellowship must also have secured a

position that focuses on public policy. For-profit law firms that perform public interest work are qualifying employers for one fellowship: the Public Interest and Rural Community Sustainability Fellowship. See the list of 2023 Summer Fellowship Opportunities for more details on the qualifying firms.

6. Proof that your student account is in good standing
